Glimpses of Grace...by Rev. Deb Kinney

Dear Church family,

It is with mixed emotions that I write to tell you Dr. Don Allgood has retired from his position as Director of Visitation, effective Oct. 31st. The emotions are mixed because I am going to miss Dr. Don, and I know many of his regular 'visitees' will miss him too. However, I also am glad he is finally taking some time to have a life without schedules. Dr. Don said his life has been regulated and scheduled since 1957 – that was the year he graduated from veterinary school, moved to Burlington and re-opened the veterinary practice of Dr. Beard.

Around the time Dr. Don sold his veterinary practice, he was hired as Director of Small Groups and Visitation. That happened on Nov. 1st, 2003 and since that time Dr. Don has been the driving force behind the success of our small groups ministries. Most small groups have a life span of 2-5 years, but thanks to Dr. Don's intentional care of, and attention to, the small groups, some of ours have been together for nearly the duration of his time on staff. Over the years, Dr. Don took special care of the Gems. Weekly he provided lessons or video programs that stretched minds and imaginations. Regularly he planned trips, whether to interesting parts of Iowa or the regular pilgrimage to the Dutch Store at Cantril. Dr. Don, however, was never one to rest on his laurels. It was under his tutelage that the new Mariner's Group was formed earlier this year.

In many ways, Dr. Don has been the face of First Presbyterian Church at the hospital, nursing homes and rehabilitation facilities these past 8 years, as he regularly visited the homebound and those who spent any time at Great River Medical Center. Time and again people would tell me how much it meant to see Dr. Don at their hospital room door, to have him spend time with them, to have him pray for them or to have him serve them communion. Dr. Don's regular care for our church family was something he took seriously each and every day.

In the four years Dr. Don and I have worked together, I have come to appreciate his great sense of humor, his loyalty to FPC, his pride and care for his ever-growing family, and his love and devotion to God and His people. Dr. Don is a true disciple of Jesus, first and foremost. He is also a true friend, a doting grandpa, a loving husband and a proud poppa.

The Personnel Committee is extending an invitation to everyone to come and celebrate Dr. Don's ministry after worship on Sunday, Nov. 6th. Dr. Don would rather avoid the reception and all the attention, but when I promised it would be modest, he agreed to attend. So, we will forego most of the flowery speeches, there will be no all-expenses-paid trip around the world, but we will take time to honor and celebrate Dr. Don's 8 years of staff ministry, and say 'thank you!' for a job very well done.

Coming Soon to a Computer Near You!...by Rex Beetner

I have to begin by saying: The technical aspects of web-page design are frustrating! Web pages need to look the same regardless of the viewer's choice of a web browser program and the size and resolution of their monitor. There are no clear standards. I now appreciate more than ever all the work that Craig Osborn put into ours.

In this age of instant information, 'church shopping' often starts on the web. People can get the feel of a church before committing to a visit to see if it best fits their needs. They want to know if they will be welcomed or is it strictly for those who follow a rigid doctrine? Is it kid friendly? Handicapped accessible? Does it have convenient hours? Does it have a host of activities that interest them? Some wonder if the members are funny-looking ... I think you get the idea. Some folks might even be planning a wedding and looking for a good church to perform the ceremony.

Many churches use professional web programmers to create fantastic sites. The only drawback to their sites is that they seldom contain current information about what is going on inside the church. These sites have a harder time growing with the church. Church members do not contribute to those sites and as such they are better suited for the 'mega' churches than for smaller and friendlier church families.

We have made it a goal to create a dynamic website for First Presbyterian Church. On our new website, we plan to create a virtual tour of our church. Folks will be able to download past sermons or newsletters to see what our message is all about. We have also included a Facebook link for those who enjoy social media interaction. Our new webpage will continue to grow in content and keep all activities current. This also means that everyone in our congregation will have information or pictures to add to it. We have other goals in mind. Besides welcoming potential visitors to give us a try, we want to show the world we are a friendly congregation that welcomes all. Directions, time of worship, handicap accessibility and what to expect will be demonstrated. We will show the world all that we do in Christ's name.

Besides telling the world about our numerous missions and activities, we will also be telling it to ourselves. We will be documenting the various ways we represent God at First Presbyterian. We need both the moderators and members of all committees to explain what they are about in their own words. Pictures are needed to help demonstrate our commitment. No one person knows everything about all of our church's activities.

The "**Home**" page will have a 14-picture slide show to show off our church and its members. These pictures will change from time to time. The 'Home' page is the most important part of the site. This is where we may capture a visitor's attention to look further.

Under the category "**In Memory**" you may have loved ones you would like to include. You may submit pictures (as many as you wish) of a loved one, stories, information and a special prayer you would like to use. Everything is welcome. You can submit your loved ones to me electronically or give it to me, Cindy Murphy, Sue Sattler, Deb Scott or Pastor Deb. These will get first priority on the website.

You may also submit names of loved ones serving in the military; we will honor them as well. When Nancy & I left for the military 40 years ago we pretty much lost our connection to the church family. A couple decades came to pass before we came back. Today's technology allows us to stay connected with our extended church family.

Another area that may be of interest is in the historical archive group. Upon my retirement January 31st, I will be digitizing everything I see, including the pictures of every pastor who has served at FPC. I also want to include the former Westminster Presbyterian and Faith Presbyterian churches. I want to uncover all the mysteries and history behind our church. What started the fire in the early 1900's? What about the fire in 2007? Why has our bell tower always been empty? I also need stories from our congregation about what they remember from earlier years.

A very important section that we will have on this website is a place for personal **Faith Statements** or testimonials from our members. I am working on mine now. John Calvin believed that we all have unique and personal relationships with God. God never assigned us a Social Security number or an employee number. We are all unique in God's eyes and our relationship with Him is personal. No two Faith Statements will ever be the same. The Faith Statement that you share might just resonate with someone else. (con't)

We take time from our hectic lives to worship together. We leave some of our material wealth behind when we leave. Most of us pass by numerous nice churches to get to our church even though they might suit our needs just as well. What makes this place of worship so special to us? I know many people who just do not understand our leap of faith. They have never understood what a relationship to God is or what it means to us. I absolutely know that faith statements will connect to others somewhere in the world. If they cannot attend our church, we may still make a connection to them and to God.

Our new revised web site will be uploaded **January 1st**. For a sneak preview, you can view our secret temporary testing site at: <http://www.beetner.com/FPCtest/FPC.html> We need your input on a lot of these links. You are the experts on what we do and what we are about.

Each page has a few quick-pick links on the bottom. Once the official site is up and hosted on our present website, changes will be documented on the **Changes** tab at the bottom. This will allow you to see what has just been added or changed.

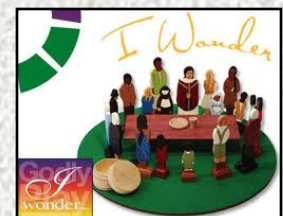

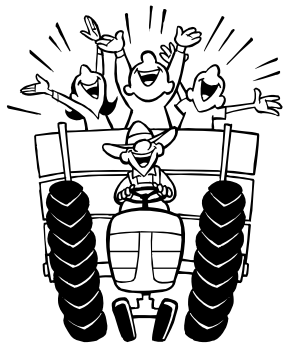

Minutes of the Stated Meeting of Session September 19, 2011 1st Presbyterian Church, Burlington, Iowa

A Stated Meeting of the Session of First Presbyterian Church, Burlington, Iowa was held in the church parlor on September 19, 2011. **Rev. Deb Kinney** opened the meeting at 7:00 p.m. with prayer. A quorum was present.

Rev. Deb Kinney gave each elder a copy of the *Book of Order-2011/2013*. She highlighted portions of the “Foundations of Presbyterian Polity” from Chapter One including: God’s Mission, Jesus Christ is Head of the Church, and The Calling of the Church.

Dick Fischer from the Mason Road Task Force assisted by **Arnie Anderson**, session liaison to the task force, gave a report on the group’s progress. They shared concept drawings prepared by Standard of Beaverdale for a multipurpose building to be erected on the Mason Road property. The task force is seeking additional designs from other companies. The task force also developed a list of possible fundraising ideas.
