Glimpses of God's Grace

Dear church family,

I have been reading William H. Willimon's *Undone by Easter, Keeping Preaching Fresh*, as we make our way towards the wonderful celebration of Jesus' resurrection. I enjoy thinking and planning for Easter (our annual informal sunrise service by the lake at 6:30 a.m. at the residence of Bill Carter and Sue Lyon and our traditional worship service at 10 a.m. in the sanctuary). This will be my 7th time preaching this good news message in Burlington and it never grows old. Has it gotten old for you?

Willimon believes the truth of the gospel doesn't need special effects or added entertainment value, even though our society desires that more and more in all aspects of life. Rather, he quotes Dietrich Bonhoeffer who reminds us that as we preach, we preach Jesus Christ Himself. And the Son of God certainly needs no special effects or added entertainment!

"The proclaimed word has its origin in the incarnation of Jesus Christ," Bonhoeffer wrote in *Worldly Preaching*. "It neither originates from truth once perceived nor from personal experience. It is not the reproduction of a specific set of feelings ... The proclaimed word is the incarnate Christ Himself... The preached Christ is both the Historical One and the Present One ... The proclaimed word is not a medium of expression for something else, something which lies behind it, but rather is the Christ Himself walking through His congregation as the Word."

Wow. Jesus Christ walks through our congregation as the Word of God is proclaimed. This happens each Sunday as we worship the Triune God! Do you sense it? Do you miss it when you are unable to attend? Do you want to share it with someone else?

One of the desires of the Worship Committee is that you will take the opportunity to invite a family member, neighbor, friend, co-worker to worship with us Easter morning. We even have a Rex Beetner photo of one of our stained-glass windows on a postcard for you to give out. Will you prayerfully consider who God might be asking you to invite this year? You may be someone's answer to a prayer, wondering if anyone cares about them or their future. Or you may be the one to introduce them to the Present One, God-With-Us, who is walking through our congregation each and every Sunday, including Easter!

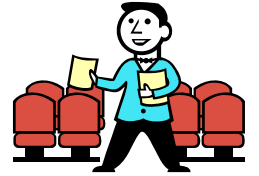

The trustees requested approval to withdraw \$54,000 from the Covenant Income Fund and have Four Points Financial invest \$14,000 in a one year certificate of deposit and invest \$40,000 in three bond funds and one non-bond fund (\$10,000 in each fund). A motion to approve the request was seconded and approved by voice vote.

Rev. Debra Kinney asked the session how the new bi-monthly meeting schedule is working. The elders gave favorable comments on the new schedule. The session will continue meeting every-other-month with the next meeting on March 17, 2014.

What's Happening Now

A motion was made and seconded to approve **Tammy Hulett** and any interested preteens from First Presbyterian Church to attend the SuperStart! event in Bloomington, IL on March 7-8, 2014. Last year Tammy and three children from First Presbyterian Church attended SuperStart! Other churches have been invited to attend the same event. The motion was approved by voice vote.

Rev. Debra Kinney shared that she has accepted several responsibilities this year including Administrative Commissioner/ Moderator of the Mediapolis Presbyterian Church, Committee on Preparation for Ministry Moderator, and Reader of Ordination Exams for PC(USA).

Rev. Debra Kinney shared that the annual Clerk's Questionnaire for the Presbyterian Church (USA) asked the question, "During 2013, how many different individuals would you estimate that the members of your congregation served or ministered among as they carried out the various activities, programs, and outreach of the congregation?" The session reflected on and discussed the question noting several areas where our congregation touched lives including Kids Against Hunger, Fifth Sunday Dirty Hands projects at Aldo Leopold Middle School and South Hill neighborhood, Salvation Army meals, food pantry donations, Boomerang Backpacks, Hope Haven birthday parties, University of Iowa Cancer Patients, Young House Family Services, Homeless Shelter, Camp Wyoming, Domestic Violence Shelter, and international missionaries. The clerk reported that he responded that our congregation helped 10,000 people, but that may be too low. The elders agreed that the congregation needs to be made more aware of how the ministries and missions of First Presbyterian Church help so many in need locally, nationally, and internationally.

The elders were asked for prayer requests.

A motion to adjourn was seconded and approved by voice vote.

Rev. Debra Kinney closed the meeting with prayer.
