Glimpses of God's Grace

Dear Church Family,

It is that time of year again! Time for me to head to the West Coast and immerse myself for 2 weeks in reading, study, class, eating, reading, study, class, sleeping, at San Francisco Theological Seminary. I will be taking parts 2 and 3 of the 4-part curriculum currently needed to finish my Doctorate of Ministry degree. That means the end is in sight, sort of, as next year will be my final 2-week class time and then the project and writing will begin. In the meantime, however, I am taking 2 classes this summer. One class focuses on formulating a dissertation project and the other class is called *Leadership in the Time of Exodus*.

I have already begun reading books with titles like, *Journey in the Wilderness*, *New Life for Mainline Churches*; *Making Spiritual Sense*, *Christian Leaders as Spiritual Interpreters*, and *Learning While Leading*, *Increasing Your Effectiveness in Ministry*. Having recently journeyed with many of you through the Old Testament, including a time with the people of Israel as they wandered through the wilderness for 40 years, I find the comparison between that wandering and the experience of the mainline churches and denominations the past 40 years intriguing.

As one author, Gil Rendle, writes: 'the metaphor of exodus is meant to help us recognize ourselves as a displaced people who need to trust God for our future and who need to be willing to learn new ways and reshape our lives as we travel. The metaphor allows us to recall that without courage fear overwhelms, and the people will prefer to return to the old but deadly slaveries. We recall that in the wilderness old diets are replaced with new foods; old slave masters are replaced with new leaders, organization, and structure. We recall that there are times when the path ahead seems so clear it is as if lit by a pillar of fire; there are times when the path ahead is so unclear it is best to pitch a tent and wait. ... We recall also that through such a messy and oh-so-human exodus, the people are changed from those who were slaves in the old land to become a new nation for God, called to live in a new place.'

I have seen the truth of these words as I have worked with others within the Presbytery of East Iowa as we seek to live into the new *Form of Government* and make changes that will impact how we do ministry better. Sometimes it feels like we are wandering, trying to find our way in this new landscape of opportunity, and other times it feels like we are indeed making headway as we seek to serve. There are also similar times of wandering and clarity in our local ministries, as our Board of Deacons, Board of Trustees and Session seek to live into God's call for us here in 2014. The reality is, change is always in the air. The other reality is, we do not like change very much, if at all. The good news is that God is in control, that we can trust God for our future and that we can believe that God only wants the very best for us as we seek to love and serve Him and our neighbors.

Remember, this life of faith is a journey, with a wonderful destination (the promised land) at its end!

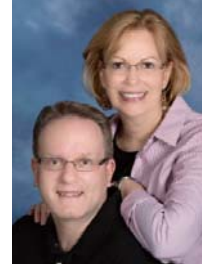
Newsorthy Notes

Dear Friends,

We rejoice with the angels in heaven that my father did his best to live the two greatest commandments (Mark 12:30-31): "Love the Lord, your God, with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength" and "Love your neighbor as yourself".
