SHOE BOX PACKING

1. Standard size shoe box or small plastic container. Can gift wrap lid & bottom separately, but not required.
2. Choose boy or girl for gift, and select age group: 2-4, 5-9 or 10-14. Obtain proper boy/girl label in Fellowship Hall. Mark the correct age group on the label & tape it to the box top.
3. Add gifts to the box that will bring delight to a child. See the list of suggested gift items below.
4. A donation of \$7 for each shoe box will cover shipping & other costs. Individuals may want to just fill a shoe box or two and others may want to just provide funds to cover the above mentioned expenses. A check should be made out to First Presbyterian Church adding Shoe Box Gift to the memo line or place cash in an envelope marked Shoe Box Gift, and place in the Sunday offering or deliver to the church office.



GIFT LIST

- Hygiene Items:** toothbrush, toothpaste, mild bar soap (in a plastic bag), comb, & washcloth.
- School Supplies:** pens, pencils & sharpener, crayons or markers, stamps & ink pad sets, writing pads or paper, solar calculators, coloring & picture books.
- Toys:** small cars, balls, dolls, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, small Etch-A-Sketch®, toys that light up or make noise (with extra batteries), & Slinky®.
- Other:** hard candy & lollipops (please double bag all candy), mints, gum, T-shirts, socks, ball caps, sunglasses, hair clips, toy jewelry, watches, & flashlights (with extra batteries).
- DO NOT INCLUDE:** used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; chocolate or food; out-of-date candy; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.

Glimpses of God's Grace

Dear church family,

Last month, for our session meeting and for the Committee on Preparation for Ministry meeting that I moderate, I gave devotions based on Exodus 3, Moses and the burning bush. I reminded the leaders at both meetings that it was only after Moses paused from his duties of tending sheep and went over to investigate the burning bush that God spoke to him. And Moses responded, 'Here I am.'

Often God puts miracles in our path, in our lives, and then waits for us to notice. And respond. Sometimes the response is a word of gratitude, sometimes the response is answering God's calling of our name for a particular way of serving Him and others. The miracles may be as miraculous as a bush that burns on its own or as 'ordinary' as a beautiful fall day. The reality is, God is always at work, always providing what we need, always giving us Himself as we notice and respond to His grace.

Last month I introduced you to a book I read during my study leave, by Ruth Haley Barton, *Strengthening the Soul of Your Leadership*. I want to share another passage that I shared with our officers because it reminds us of how we are to notice and respond as spiritual leaders: "Strengthening the soul of our leadership is an invitation that begins, continues and ends with seeking God in the crucible of ministry. It is an invitation to stay connected with our own soul—that very private place where God's Spirit and my spirit dwell together in union—and to lead from that place. ... This is a place where we don't have all the answers—or at least not necessarily when everybody wants them! It is a place where we are not in control; God is. It is a place where the quickest way is not always the best way, because the transformation that is happening in us is more important than getting where we think we need to go." (p. 210)

Our journey with God, as spiritual leaders (ruling elders), servant leaders (deacons) and as ministers (everyone), needs to be similar to aspects of Moses' journey with God. It begins with taking the time away from our busy schedules and ministries to notice God's presence in our midst. It begins with responding to God's call to love Him and our neighbors and saying, 'Here I am.' It continues with reminders that God is in control, not you or I. It continues with reminders that just because we want to have all the answers yesterday, God rarely works in that way. And it continues with reminders that God is more concerned about what is happening with our souls, with the part of our inner being that communes with Him, than with our agendas, programs and plans.

So, as we engage a new season of ministry, I encourage you to pray for our elders (Jim French, Vickie Carhoff, Deb Scott, Charles Bell, Marilyn Nuss, Julie Schulthies, Dick Fischer, Bonnie White, Carol Brotherson (and clerk Ted Francis)), our deacons (Kevin Eibes, Jay Schafer, Jolene Schafer, Pat Saldeen, Rex Beetner, Nancy Beetner, Barb Garcia, Ruth Francis, Sandy Smith, Sandy Russell, Adele Coulter, Cathy Brink) and our trustees (Connie Bowen, Kel Stensland, Francis McAllister, Larry Lazenby). I encourage you to pray for our staff (Isaac Wells, Christine Dwight, Sandy Morrison, Tammy Hulett, Millie Comiskey, Vickie Carhoff, Camille Reynen, Linda Hale, Ashley Brink, Anna Dodge). And I encourage you to love them as your neighbors as they seek to serve God on your behalf.

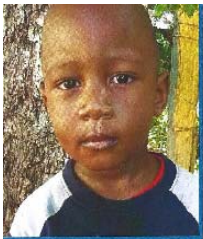

Rev. Clerk of Session **Ted Francis** reported that the Presbytery has begun to reorganize under the New Form of Government approved by the General Assembly in 2011. He expects training and guidance will be available to help congregations update their bylaws to conform with the new Book of Order. He will discuss this with the Stated Clerk at the Session Minutes review meeting this September.

Clerk of Session **Ted Francis** reported that a grant to help defray the cost of digitizing church records and membership rolls is available from the Presbyterian Historical Society. He will research the application process for submission.

What's Happening Now

Each elder spoke briefly about his/her committee assignment and the moderators shared their committee's current work.
