Glimpses of God's Grace

Dear church family,

We are entering a brief season looking at passionate worship. There has been much musing about what IS passionate worship and have discovered it means different things to different people. For some, passionate worship involves the emotions to the point of 'feeling God's presence' with the body engaged (such as raising of hands during songs of praise). For others it means being open to what God is doing in our midst, as He often uses worship to transform lives, heal wounded souls, renew hope, shape decisions, provoke change, inspire compassion, and bind us to each other. Whether the encounter with God is more meditative, through the mind/intellect, or more emotive, passionate worship is not dry, routine, or boring. Nor is it something to entertain us. Rather, it is celebrating and worshipping the Triune God, expressing our love for Him and allowing Him to meet us or engage us as His Spirit moves.

Just as we are discovering that we are never 'done' with radical hospitality and will continue to seek new ways to welcome the stranger, we will continue to explore ways and means in which our worship experience might provide opportunities to love, serve and praise God ever-more passionately.

For the better part of October we will be exploring risk-taking mission and service. Some of our missions work might already fall into this category. However, as God continues to open our hearts and eyes to opportunities and needs in the greater Burlington area and beyond, we may find He is calling us to 'risk' even more of ourselves as we love the stranger as well as we love ourselves.

A September issue of our Presbytery's online newsletter contained an article in which 8 churches from our denomination have received grants from the Presbytery Mission Agency to do 'risky mission.' 'The DREAM (Developmental, Risky, Experimental, Adaptive Mission) Grant is meant to encourage risk-takers who are not afraid to fail in church cultures,' the article reads. Some of the risky initiatives included transforming an empty lot into a community garden in the shape of the Jerusalem cross; inviting community members for a weekly dinner and worship; starting an after-school program in the community; developing a summer youth mission program with service projects.

Our Missions Committee, under the leadership of ruling elders Julie Schulthies and Steve Hemphill, is always looking for ways to meet more needs, locally and internationally. Will the committee move forward on a 'risky mission (im)possible'? Stay tuned!

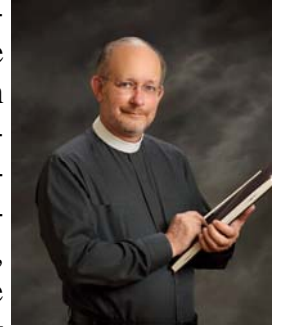

Reflections from Rev'd Randy Webster

What does the word “worship” mean to you? I would suspect it has many different definitions. The Bible is full of verses commanding us to worship God; the word is used over 200 times in the Bible, and Jesus himself uses it over thirteen times. I would suggest that worship describes all those times when we gather deliberately seeking to encounter God in Jesus Christ, and that God uses those experiences for many outcomes— to transform our lives, to heal wounded souls, to renew hope in us, to shape our decisions, to provoke change, to inspire compassion, and to bind us together as the Body of Christ. Notice that I didn't relegate it to the community experience only on Sunday morning at 10 a.m. Worship, in its many facets, happens throughout our day and our week, and the word “passionate” expresses an intense desire, an ardent spirit, strong feelings, and the sense of heightened importance.



Secular society would like to inform our use of that word, but ultimately it tells us what worship is not. We can fall into the trap of thinking that worship is about us and what we gain from it. We can come expecting to be entertained which is what happens everywhere else we go. Worship is about expressing our love for God and what God has done for us. Passionate worship is worship that focuses all our energy to God and allows us the ability to express our love for God and all that God has done for us.

Perhaps one of the biggest stumbling blocks to passionate worship is the baggage that we all bring with us to worship, and it causes us to not be able to actively engage what happens while we are here. We have so many things on our minds, decisions to be made, problems unsolved, and perhaps we don't like the music, or the person who is the liturgist, or we disagree with something the preacher said. But the truth is that worship isn't about us! If we come having prepared ourselves (yes, read through the bulletin that comes in Glimpses of Grace and take a look at the hymns before the service starts) and we ask God to help us enter into worship, we can become active participants in God's worship and not just passive bystanders. Come to worship expecting to meet God, and participate fully in worship by focusing on what is being said or sung. If we do, God is trying to speak to each of us and to shape us!

Recommendations can come from anyone — the pastor, elders, deacons, trustees, members of the congregation.

When a need is brought to the Deacons' attention, they will pay the money from the Love Fund.

The amount given will depend on the need, and how much is needed. Deacon board will decide the amount to be given, and ask the church office to money is in the Love Fund.

So, What do Deacons do?

- *Hospital Visitations* is visiting those from FPC who are hospitalized.
- *Meal Ministry* provides meals to families who have been hospitalized, are celebrating a birth or in need.
- *Knitwits* meets monthly to fellowship and knit/crochet prayer shawls.
- *Notes/Cards* provides contact to members and friends who have had a serious illness/death in the family, or a special occasion such as a memorable anniversary or birthday.

Special Friends provides regular contact/support to people who are homebound or living in nursing homes and have limited ability to attend church.

- *Young Adult Outreach* makes regular contact with young adults in college or serving in the military.
- *Extended communion* is for special friends who are no longer able to attend worship but would like to still receive the sacrament.
- *Back-up to Pastoral Care* provides the congregation another contact person in case the pastor is not available. Contacts other deacons regarding concerns.
- *Ushers & Greeters* are responsible for welcoming all to worship. Ushers make sure visitors know where restrooms, nursery and Fellowship Hall are located. Ushers introduce visitors to members.

Carol Brotherson was elected Clerk Pro Tem for the meeting.
A quorum was present.

A motion was made to approve the consent agenda including the minutes from the session meeting on May 18, 2015; staff reports from **Rev. Debra Kinney**, **Rev. Randy Webster** and **Tammy Hulett**; session committee reports; the trustee report; and **Ed Whitmore's** oral report on the Presbytery of East Iowa's June 9th Presbytery meeting in Monticello.

Report of the Clerk:

The Rev'd Webster requested the use of Fellowship Hall and Kitchen on Sunday, Aug. 23 to host a party celebrating the 60th anniversary of his parents, Shirley and Shirley Webster, from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m.. **Approved by voice vote.**

Approve the resignation of ruling elder Vickie Carhoff, effective May 19, 2015. **Approved by voice vote.**

Worshipful Work:

1. Voted to change communion date from July 5 to July 12, 2015. **Approved by voice vote.**
2. **Marilyn Nuss** nominated **JoAnn Williams** to be Clerk of Session. **Approved by voice vote.**
3. **Charles Bell** moved that money from Gifts and Memorials, if approved by that committee, be loaned to a church member for medical bills which are beyond the ability to pay.

Motion seconded and approved by voice vote.

4. **Rev. Randy** issued an invitation to the visioning retreat about radical hospitality on Saturday, July 18 at 9 a.m.

Good news from committees:

Nominating: **Marilyn Nuss** noted **Cheryl Lotz** has agreed to complete the unexpired term (2 years) of **Vickie Carhoff** as elder. **Charles Bell** moved that a congregational meeting be set for July 19, 2015, after church for the sole purpose of receiving the report of the nominating committee and electing the elder. **Motion seconded and approved by voice vote.**

Missions: **Julie Schulthies** noted a meal will be served at the Salvation Army the end of June. On the next 5th Sunday, August 30, the Clean Hands will make a meal for the firemen. The Dirty Hands are checking on painting a 2-story house and/or a possible South Hill project. Monthly donations to the Treasure Chest are encouraged. Our church will participate in the citywide Paint-a-thon in September.

Personnel: **Dick Fischer** thanked Deb for her support.

Scholarships: **Charles Bell** informed the group that \$3,000 in funds that the committee was unaware of were found. Eight recipients will each receive an approximately \$1000 scholarship.

Worship: **Carol Brotherson** encouraged elders, as spiritual leaders of the church, to participate in the Season of Prayer time which will be held in the sanctuary prior to worship services this summer.

Worship Committee moved giving away some old, unused offering plates and communion trays. **Motion approved by voice vote.** Pastor Deb will see if they can be used by another church. If not, Session will decide what to do with them.

What's Happening Now!

Session Committees have been restructured to include two new committees: Worship, Music, and the Arts – moderator **Ed Whitmore**; and Radical Hospitality – moderator **Camille Reynen**. This will replace the current Worship and Fellowship committees, and there will be overlapping among other committees and church groups.

Deb reminded moderators to monitor their monthly committee budget statement. Errors have been found, and Deb has expressed our dissatisfaction to the company handling the statements. Moderators should approve all expenses. Contact Sandy in the office with questions or errors.
